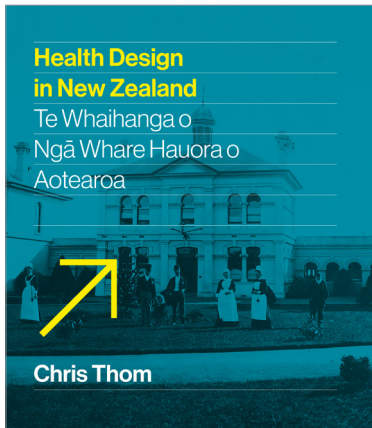

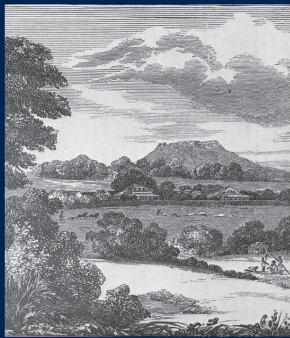

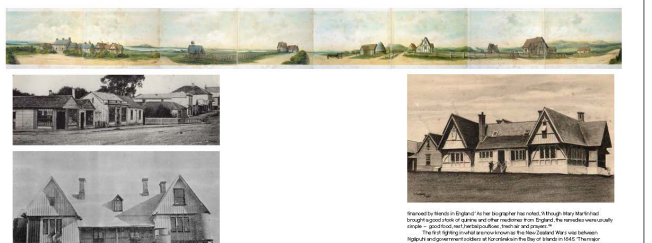
Northern Hospital, Auckland, 1830–1851



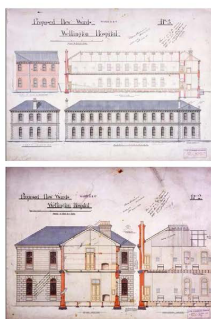
James Cook Memorial Hospital, Auckland, 1900–1905



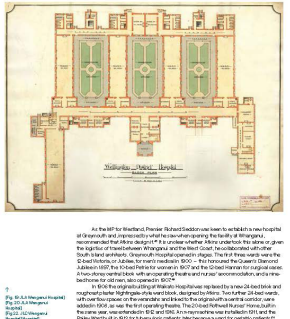

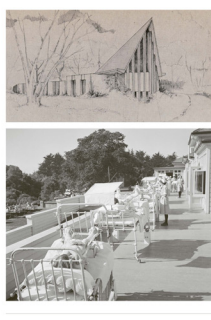

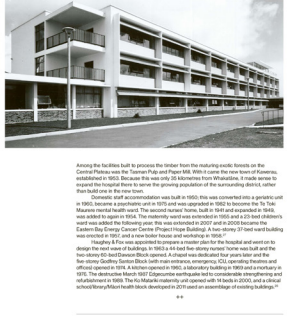
